II – REVIEW MINUTES – 1/27/2020

Michael Chambers motioned to approve the minutes from the January 27, 2020 meeting; Nan Baker seconded. The minutes were approved by unanimous vote, as written.

Paul Herdeg, Department of Development, presented. Trevor McAleer asked for clarification as to whether the \$35,000.00 will fund a staff person at Greater Cleveland Partnership (GCP) to review economic development loans and asked why the County could not staff the Cuyahoga County Community Improvement Corporation (CCCIC); stated that from a strategic standpoint, with or without the \$35,000.00 payment, that the County would have a good relationship with GCP in terms of coming up with economic development packages to attract other business and not sure why the County would pay for operational support for someone to record keep and clerk the meetings while we have the capability in house; stated there would still be a partnership in this process between CCCIC and GCP without the operational support; asked if the County provides any other financial support to GCP aside from this request; asked if the Department of Development will be requesting additional financial support for other initiatives to GCP; stated that it is important to expand the services and the relationship with GCP as a strategic partner but feels the County can manage the administrative functions; and asked if the organization's budget could be shared with the Board members.

Nan Baker asked how the amount of this payment compares to the revenue received by GCP that has been exhausted and asked how the amount of \$35,000.00 was determined; asked if this support would be necessary if interest rates were to increase as the organization could use other sources of revenue; asked if other sources of revenue were considered where this payment would not be necessary; asked for clarification on the funding source and stated that she was pleased that this payment is only for one year so that other options could be explored or the funds absorbed elsewhere; and stated that there needs to be an understanding of the total overall funding provided to the organization.

Dale Miller motioned to approve the item; Trevor McAleer seconded. Item BC2020-91 was approved by majority vote with Michael Chambers recusing, as he serves on the Board of the Cuyahoga County Community Improvement Corporation.
